

Risk Assessment Template

As a facility provider, you should complete your own COVID-19 Risk Assessment and publish this to your users.

If you are not the facility provider, then you should consider which sections will apply to your clubs individual situation upon returning to play and complete a risk assessment based on your activity, including (but not limited to) people management and communication, hygiene and first aid. You may still wish to record that you have assessed facility risks through enquiries made with your facility provider.

We have provided an example risk assessment below, which is for illustrative purposes only, and includes some examples of things to consider. Consider how this will apply to each aspect of your operation and identify the controls you require to meet Government guidance regarding health, social distancing and hygiene etc. Remember that you must review your other Health and Safety, and Safeguarding, risk assessments for other hazards such as fire, first aid etc.

During play

- Players should keep at least 1.5 metres from others.
- No spitting.
- No saliva to be applied to the ball.
- Cap/pullovers not to be given to umpires.
- Equipment including gloves, pads and helmets should not be shared
- Batters keep to distinct running lines to ensure they are not within 2m from others
- The ball will be returned direct to the bowler either on the full or rolled along the ground. It should not be passed around the field.
- Players will be required to sanitise their hands after every 6 overs or 20 minutes whichever is shorter
- It will be the responsibility of the fielding Captain to sanitise the ball before play recommences
- Bowlers returning to their mark should maintain social distancing when passing the umpire
- Bowlers should maintain social distancing when making any appeals
- Scorers should remain socially distant from others
- Equipment should not be shared including laptops and tablets unless cleaned first.
- Communal scorebooks which are passed from one person to another should be avoided as much as possible
